Welcome to the 48th South Wales and West of England Regional Industrial Archaeology Conference, to be held at the Llanhilleth Miners Institute, Llanhilleth, Blaenau Gwent

Leaving the M4 motorway at junction 28, follow the signs for The A467 road to Ebbw Vale and Brynmawr. Through the Traffic lights at Crumlin, with the former Navigation Colliery On the left, continue to follow signs to Ebbw Vale and Brynmawr. Follow designated signs to Llanhilleth Miners Institute.

Car parking is free and plentiful.

The A467 takes you all the way to Llanhilleth , approximately 11 Miles or 20 minutes drive time.

For train travellers, Arriva Trains operate an hourly service between Cardiff and Llanhilleth, the station being two minutes from the institute.

The venue has full access for disabled persons.

Field Visits

A. THE Guardian.

An explosion at the Six Bells colliery on the 2 8th June 1960 resulted in the deaths of 45 miners. Exactly 50 years later the Archbishop of Canterbury unveiled a memorial on the site of the colliery. The Guardian is an iconic 66 ft statue designed and created by Sebastian Boyesen and consisting of thousands of steel ribbons. It is located about 2 miles north of Llanhilleth with a flat short walk from the car park. There is a small museum opposite the car park.

B. Fourteen Locks.

The Cefn Flight of fourteen locks was probably the most ambitious engineering project, when the Crumlin arm of the Monmouthshire Canal was constructed in 1790 under the watchful eye of the engineer Thomas Dadford jun.

C. Oxford House Museum.

The museum has a unique collection of artifacts relating to our industrial past. Also a complete Edwarden Chemist Shop, which must be seen to be belived. Plus, an addition on the upper floor of a working Model Railway.

D. The Spiteful.

A dispute in the early 1800's led to a row of cottages being built across a proposed tramroad. The full story will be told in the final conference lecture. You visit the actual site where the remains of the cottages and remnants of the tramroad are still visible. The car park is in Abercarn, just off the A467 the main road from the conference to the M4. There is a short easy walk to the site.
