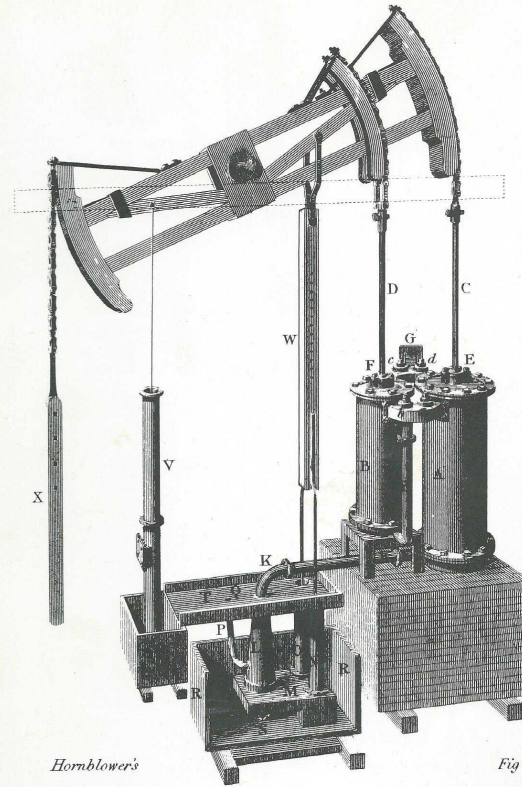


Part of the map surveyed in 1793 and published by John Cary c.1796
 The Homblower-Winwood engine was erected at the 'Radstock Middle Coalwork'.
 'Upper Coalwork' was known later as 'Old Pit'.



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From Rees's Cyclopaedia showing the first compound steam engine erected by Homblower and Winwood, 1781-2 at Middle Pit, Radstock, as it was in 1797. The separate condenser at (L) did not infringe Watt's patent of 1769 as Boulton and Watt had antedated its use some time between May 1790 and 1792
