

BRISTOL I.A. REFERENCES FROM OLD LOCAL NEWSPAPERS.

Martin Bodman.

This is a list of abstracts culled from 18th and 19th Century local newspapers that are kept at the Bristol Central Library - Reference Section, relating to industrial sites in the environs of the City of Bristol.

As such they are ones that caught my eye while I was trawling for watermill material, and are in no way comprehensive nor definitive. Many of the abstracts are not complete - merely tasters of the actual advertisements, which can of course be referred to at the library. They are published for what they are worth, and in the hope it will save other researchers some time and effort on their own particular projects.

It has been suggested to me by the Editor that this could be the start of an I.A. newspaper abstract-index database to which others could add items, similarly chanced upon in the course of their research.

Just a note or two for BIAS members researching at Bristol Central Library

i) the bound volumes of Victorian newspapers are now usually ordered at the desk in the Reference section upstairs in the normal way on a yellow slip, and will be delivered for use in the South Reading Room (which conveniently also contains the 19th and 20th Century local Town Directories on open shelf)

ii) Papers prior to 1800 are largely stored on Microfilm; 'readers' are available opposite the Enquiry desk.

I personally hope to separate out information on Mills and factories in Devonshire and also in Wiltshire in the months to come and already have done so for South Wales and the Forest of Dean, otherwise leaving out Gloucestershire which largely appears to be covered in Jennifer Tann's book.
