

All Saints Weston, Bath – The Church Clock

For those who've not seen, the church clock has stopped and needs some substantial repairs. There are worn components, and the clock mechanism (above) will be removed from the bell tower and taken away on 4th August for the work to be done. The work will take up to eight weeks to complete and is being done by Coffins Clocks in Keynsham.

More information on the clock: The name 'Wadhams, Bath' is on the pilot dial and he was operating as a clockmaker circa 1846 to 1878. The clock can be described as a Victorian cast-iron flatbed, hand-wound, hour striking movement with a double 'three-legged gravity' escapement. The clock has a redundant and partially dismantled hour striking train. The clock drives 2x 4ft copper convex dials that were recently refurbished, as were the bevel gears and dial motion works.
